Is Patchwork for You?

There are many different patchwork styles, and I am sure that many WI members across the county would like to try new techniques without having to produce a whole quilt!



With this in mind, we have come up with the idea of setting up a Patchwork Group where members will learn how to make a different block each month, alongside benefitting an area of our hospitals that misses out on the quilts donated by Project Linus. Neonatal units much appreciate that ongoing supply of quilts, but we have heard that every month, several babies arrive at Emergency Departments but do not live to be admitted to children's wards. How awful for parents to lose a precious child and how much worse if the parting cuddle is with the much-loved child wrapped in an

old towel? We would love to support these families so we thought that perhaps we could combine producing quilts for these families with teaching patchwork skills to our members.

We plan to set up a monthly patchwork group in which every participant learns to make a block. The blocks will then be assembled into a quilt for donation to neonatal A&E departments. Attendees would be provided with the fabric, the pattern and instructions so that there is continuity across the quilt. Hopefully each meeting will produce enough blocks to make a quilt, and members will also have enjoyed learning new skills and meeting new people. Perhaps they could then pass the skills on in their own WIs? Emergency departments would be so appreciative, and I am sure that it would make a world of difference to bereaved parents.

Train as an IFE

onerous and tends to need to be done in the first few months of the year – January to April: and WIs pay £30 to the IFE for the work undertaken.

Help us to get it right

Berkshire News, your newsletter, continues separately from this bulletin: the last Berkshire News from the last year is winging its way to you, and the first one from the new set of Trustees and from Trish will come out in two months' time. Berkshire News reflects on achievements and what we've been doing, while this bulletin looks to the future, talking about what's coming up. Do let us know if you find this division helpful: the bulletin can be produced quite quickly and so we can be more reactive, whereas Berkshire News has a long lead time by going through the publishing system.

We have heard from a number of members that the current system of booking into events is slow and unwieldy. We are looking at using an event booking system such as Eventbrite, which has been used by other Federations to allow event bookings: this does mean a small cost on the bookings but it also means that bookings can be made more easily, with a simple payment system, and it means that events can also be

offered more readily to other non-members (and perhaps convince those non-members to join!). Could you let us know if you have any views on using any of these systems? Have you tried booking through other Federations? Have you set up events yourself with a booking system, or have you booked into events yourself? Let us know.

BFWI Competition: our Yearbook cover photo

We are hoping to offer regular competitions, with the prize of a voucher to take part in any of the BFWI courses.

For our first competition, we are calling for photos of your neighbourhood: the winning photo will be used on the front of the Berkshire Federation's Yearbook and Speakers List. Every WI is given two copies of the Yearbook and Speakers List, but the winner will also receive their own copy.

The rules are fairly simple:

- Photos have to be your own work in digital format (not printed)
- It must be a photo taken within Berkshire
- Photos should preferably be in landscape format
- Photos must not include any recognisable human faces
- Photos cannot include any property where we might need to request permission from the owner(s)
- You may submit a maximum of 2 photos
- Photos must be of a high resolution for printing purposes
- The competition is open to any member of a WI which is within the Berkshire Federation

In submitting your photos, you are giving consent for us to use them in the competition for judging purposes and also in the final yearbook, where you will be credited.
